Copenhagen

And, in our book, there are few cities as well-tailored to the individual journeying alone than Copenhagen. The galleries, bakeries, beautifully designed public spaces and bike lanes make getting from Nørrebro to Nordhavn a breeze - and a friendly breeze at that. Our suggested itinerary: check into the quirky, thoughtfully decorated Hotel Sanders (owned by a former Royal Danish Ballet dancer), tuck into buttery Danish pastries and strong americanos at the streetside hotel restaurant, hop on one of the property's complimentary bikes and go. Make a beeline for the food markets in Christiania (keep your bathing suit and a towel in your backpack for impromptu dips in the city's many harbours and waterways), vegan burgers at Popl, a cycle past the hive of activity buzzing around the Noma greenhouses and onward out to the Mikkeller brewery. Day two might involve a quick zip on the train to the Louisiana Museum of Modern Art and a taco dinner for one at Noma alum Rosio Sanchez's taqueria.
