HOTEL SANDERS

Mixing five-star opulence with a relaxed and cosy hygge feeling, Hotel Sanders hits the sweet spot when it comes to luxury getaways. Brought to Copenhagen by former ballet dancer, Alexander Kolpin, this 54-room boutique hotel is aptly located down the road from the Royal Danish Theatre and is also in close proximity to the town centre, Nyhavn and the harbour front. Inside you'll be hit with low-lit rooms and colonial accents (subtle touches of browns, caramels et al), and each room comes with complimentary minibars (a big win in our eyes). Moreover, with warm and alluring facilities that you'll actually want to visit (check out the Sanders Kitchen, rooftop Conservatory and TATA bar), you may never actually leave Sanders' vicinity. And, to be honest, that may be no bad thing at all.
